Range Limitations and Safety Requirements

Always point your firearm in a safe direction
Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
Always keep the firearm unloaded until ready to use
Know your target and what is beyond
Know how to use your firearm safely
Be sure the firearm is safe to operate
Never use alcohol, prescription drugs, or recreational drugs before or during shooting
Eye and ear protection is recommended
No .50 BMG class rifles, no questionable or unsafe firearms, and no full auto firearms allowed
Semi-auto controlled fire is permitted. Controlled fire considered as no more than one shot every two seconds
No cross firing. Target position and shooting points must correspond. Must be perpendicular to target
NO GLASS TARGETS. Approved targets must be mounted on target holders, all others must align with backstop
Jacketed ammo may be used for PAPER TARGETS ONLY. Anyone caught shooting steel targets with jacketed ammo will be asked to leave, and their membership will be reviewed by the Board of Directors. Bird and Buckshot may not be used on our wooden target frames.
Every member is a safety officer. If you see any violation of our safety rules, inform the shooter to stop. Tell them the violation and the correct way to proceed.
Range Operations and Guidelines
Shooting hours are from sunrise to sunset. No shooting allowed before or after these times
All outdoor shooting ranges are open year round, unless reserved for a scheduled event or Work Bee
All firearms must be unloaded and cased while transporting to and from the range
All shooters are responsible for cleaning up after themselves, including removal of targets and policing brass. Containers are located at the range for unwanted trash
Safety and courtesy is practiced at all times
Absolutely no destruction or misuse of club property will be tolerated. Anyone found in violation will be subject to disciplinary action by the Board of Directors
All members must show their membership card upon request
GUESTS: You must accompany your guest at all times; you are responsible for his or her safety and conduct
